Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." - John 3:16-17

The church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday

are days of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) for all Catholics **from age 14 onwards**. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, **fast**, as well as **abstinence**, is also obligatory for those **from ages of 18-59**. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

Please join us next weekend to hear Rev. Msgr. David M. Walker speak at all the services about a ministry providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.

Monsignor Walker will share personal witness about Food For The Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another.

Monsignor Walker was ordained for the Archdiocese of Hartford. He has served as a pastor and hospital chaplain in his priestly ministry for over 53 years. He is now preaching on behalf of the poor with Food For The Poor.

Here are some examples, from their brochure, of what money can buy for those in need.

- Your gift of **\$30** can provide 20 chicks to a needy family. Chicks, when mature, provide poor families with sustainable income from the sale of eggs. The protein in the eggs helps prevent malnutrition in growing children.
- Your gift of \$50 can provide lifesaving meals for malnourished children.
- Your gift of **\$285** can provide a water pump. Water is difficult for poor families to obtain. A water pump can provide easy access to clean water for an entire village.
